The priest declares God's forgiveness, and all respond



And also with you.


Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N*.

for the sake of your Son,



The Eucharistic Prayer

(remain standing)


The Lord be with you

but deliver us from evil.


For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory,
