## NEW TESTAMENT READING

*Hebrews 7: 23–28*

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Hebrews.

Furthermore, the former priests were many in number, because they were prevented by death from continuing in office;<sup>24</sup> but he holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues for ever.<sup>25</sup> Consequently he is able for all time to save those who approach God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them.

<sup>26</sup> For it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens.<sup>27</sup> Unlike the

other high priests, he has no need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for those of the people; this he did once for all when he offered himself. <sup>28</sup>For the law appoints as high priests those who are subject to weakness, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect for ever.

They came to Jericho. As he and his disciples and a large crowd were leaving Jericho, Bartimaeus son of Timaeus, a blind beggar, was sitting by the roadside. <sup>47</sup>When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout out and say, ‘Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!’ <sup>48</sup>Many sternly ordered him to be quiet, but he cried out even more loudly, ‘Son of David, have mercy on me!’ <sup>49</sup>Jesus stood still and said, ‘Call him here.’ And they called the blind man, saying to him, ‘Take heart; get up, he is calling you.’ <sup>50</sup>So throwing off his cloak, he sprang up and came to Jesus. <sup>51</sup>Then Jesus said to him, ‘What do you want me to do for you?’ The blind man said to him, ‘My teacher, let

me see again.’ <sup>52</sup>Jesus said to him, ‘Go; your faith has made you well.’ Immediately he regained his sight and followed him on the way.

### **Church and COVID:**

We do not have the same restrictions as before but given cases are still about there are some things to keep in mind;

**Entry:** We do ask everyone to register as you come to church and please do use the hand sanitiser.

**Masks:** Following the government advice masks are not compulsory but they are “expected and recommended”. Please do feel encouraged to wear a mask.

**Distancing:** There are ribbons on the back pews for those who might like some more space. We are all reacting differently to the current COVID situation; some of us feel comfortable being close but others will want to keep 2m distance from each other.

**Common Cup:** Given the continued potential risks to health, we will not reintroduce the common cup at this point. We will therefore continue with communion in one kind and distribution by the chancel steps as we have been.

**Tea and Coffee** will be available after the service; please do spread apart and outside when you can.
