A reading from the letter of Paul to the  
Hebrews.

<sup>11</sup> And every priest stands day after  
day at his service, offering again and  
again the same sacrifices that can  
never take away sins. <sup>12</sup> But when  
Christ had offered for all time a single  
sacrifice for sins, 'he sat down at the  
right hand of God', <sup>13</sup> and since then  
has been waiting 'until his enemies  
would be made a footstool for his  
feet.' <sup>14</sup> For by a single offering he has  
perfected for all time those who are  
sanctified

<sup>19</sup> Therefore, my friends, since we  
have confidence to enter the

### **Church and COVID:**

We do not have the same restrictions as before but given cases are still about there are some things to keep in mind;

**Entry:** We do ask everyone to register as you come to church and please do use the hand sanitiser.

**Masks:** Following the government advice masks are not compulsory but they are “expected and recommended”. Please do feel encouraged to wear a mask.

**Distancing:** There are ribbons on the back pews for those who might like some more space. We are all reacting differently to the current COVID situation; some of us feel comfortable being close but others will want to keep 2m distance from each other.

**Common Cup:** Given the continued potential risks to health, we will not reintroduce the common cup at this point. We will therefore continue with communion in one kind and distribution by the chancel steps as we have been.

**Tea and Coffee** will be available after the service; please do spread apart and outside when you can.
